You may also bring your payment to church or pay online for a small 29¢ fee. Remember, you can reload or print many cards at any time during the month if you enroll in PrestoPay. Use the RaiseRight scrip phone app to make ordering easier. Scrip also now offers the option of having select gift cards shipped directly to you any time during the month for an additional fee. There are usually a limited number of Meijer and Speedway scrip cards available for purchase in the church office as well. If you have any questions on how this program works please contact Scrip Coordinator Mark Fritsma (MarkF@wowway.com). Earn rebates to reduce the cost of sending SCC kids to Portage Lake, Branch Adventures or a similar camp. UNITE (CHIC) returns in 2024 as well. ## **SCC Mission Moment for February 2024**

#### **Evangelism and Outreach; Community Development**

YEARS OF SERVICE: 1987-Present

The Covenant Church in Colombia is celebrating the publication of a new devotional. Written by 19 Covenant women, the devotional focuses on the stories of 13 women in the Bible, with each story unfolding in four different themes. The idea for *He Nacido Para Este Tiempo (I Was Bom for Such a Time as This)* came from the National Women's Ministries Committee of the Covenant Church of Colombia. Their vision unfolded to become 52 weeks of reflections and a yearlong biblical study. Each devotional includes a Scripture text, a meditation, and prayer with a practical spiritual exercise.


"God is calling us to a new time in our own history, to live according to his purposes so we can love, believe, and obey with confidence in Jesus to fill our lives with strength and dignity to advance into a divine future securely."

Cathy's role in the production of this devotional has been to encourage the writers, raise funds for the publishing, find a publishing house, and oversee the project in general. Colombian Covenant leader Marlen Román did the final proofreading and editing. The publishing company who did the graphics, corrections, and final editing shared how much they learned about women in the Bible and how the stories touched their lives.

The truth is, each one of us was born for "such a time as this" because God our Creator and Father purposed it to be so.







# Women's Life Group<sup>9</sup>

Both groups will be studying "Women in the New Testament:"

- Was Mary Magdalene a prostitute? Is the story of Martha of Bethany about homemaking? Were the women in Jesus's genealogy all sexual sinners? Was Junia an apostle or not?
- What do you really know about the women in the New Testament
- Often, the stories of the important women in the New Testament are left out of church teaching and Christian books. Or if they are told, they include myths and misperceptions.
- In this course, Dr. Lynn Cohick, New Testament Professor and Provost of Northern Seminary, teaches the true stories of women in the Bible. She has written several books on women in the New Testament world and the early church.
- Each session examines an aspect of the social and cultural world of the New Testament and explores a biblical woman's story in relation to her context. The course looks at marriage, at motherhood, at discipleship, at patronage, at teaching, and at leadership as New Testament women live out their callings before God and in the Christian community.
- Women studied include:
  - · Mary, mother of Jesus
  - Mary Magdalene
  - Mary and Martha of Bethany
  - Phoebe, Junia, Priscilla, Lydia
  - Unnamed women such as the Samaritan woman and Jairus's daughter.
